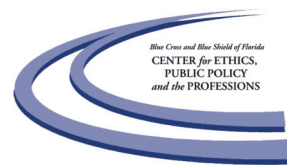
The discounted rates are available through **October 6, 2011**, or when the block of rooms is taken. Book early to avoid disappointment.
