

28th Annual Florida Bioethics Conference Set for March 27

MIAMI – Sessions on climate change, disability and hospital ethics committees lead the agenda for annual “Florida Ethics: Debates, Decisions, Solutions” conference set for March 27, 2020, in Miami.

The 28th annual conference – believed to be the oldest and largest community bioethics conference in the country – is hosted by the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine Institute for Bioethics and Health Policy and the Florida Bioethics Network.

The program is customarily approved for continuing education credits for physicians, nurses, social workers, attorneys and chaplains. It is made possible with the support of leading regional hospitals and other health care institutions, which have identified professional development in ethics as an essential component of high-quality practice.
